

Community Safety Committee

Object

The Moree Community Safety Committee is an interagency forum to address systemic issues of crime in the community and provide advice to the Council.

Criteria

- Strong community commitment and an interest in creating a safer community for the Moree Plains Shire
- High degree of integrity and honesty and respect for confidentiality
- An ability to constructively participate in an advisory capacity
- An ability to represent a broad range of views that reflect the diversity of the community (sex, age, race, religion, socio-economic)
- A strong understanding of the local community and its social, environmental and economic influences
- Good knowledge and understanding of the local issues that are relevant to community safety
- A willingness to contribute positively to meetings in a fair and unbiased manner
- An ability to look beyond personal interests for the benefit of the community and residents.

Internal Audit Committee

Object

The Internal Audit Committee provides independent assurance and assistance to the Council on risk management, control, governance and external accountability responsibilities.

Criteria

Members of the Committee are expected to:

- Understand the relevant legislative and regulatory requirements appropriate to Moree Plains Shire Council.
- Contribute the time needed to study and understand the papers provided.
- Apply good analytical skills, objectivity and good judgment.
- Express opinions frankly, ask questions that go to the fundamental core of issues, and pursue independent lines of enquiry.
- Financial expertise and/or local government experience

Urban Advisory Committee

Object

Consider matters that affect the urban environments – central business districts and entrances to town and give consideration to heritage matters including reviewing applications for funding under the Heritage Fund.

- No specific criteria however a knowledge and appreciation of matters pertaining to heritage conservation and urban design, ownership of a business and strong understanding of the community are valuable qualities for committee members to have.
